



Dr. Markus Keller

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Markus Keller is the Chateau Ste. Michelle Distinguished Professor of Viticulture at Washington State University's Irrigated Agriculture Research and Extension Center in Prosser, Washington. He received his master's degree in agronomy (plant science) and doctorate in natural sciences from the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Zürich. He has conducted research and taught on three continents at institutions such as the Swiss Federal Research Stations in Wädenswil and Changins, Switzerland, Cornell University in Geneva, New York, and Charles Sturt University in Wagga Wagga, New South Wales, Australia. His research focuses on environmental factors and management practices as they influence crop physiology of wine and juice grapes. He recently helped set up the Northwest Grape Foundation Service that provides clean planting material to the rapidly expanding grape and wine industries of the Pacific Northwest.
